Neace's Pieces Yields to Dr. Steve Rennick

Do you know that in the first 20 years of the Church of God Reformation Movement, from 1880 to 1900, that 66% of the recognized ministers and evangelists of this young,

fledgling movement were women?

66%! 2 out of 3! Can you imagine?

Do you know that today in the Church of God in Kenya that this number is nearly the same? More than 60% of the active pastors of the Church of God in Kenya are women!

In East Africa, the clear majority of pastors in the Church of God are women!

Do you know that today in the Church of God in North America that this number is now below 10%, that less than 1 out of 10 of our active pastors are women?

Really? Are you serious?

I have a simple message: We Can Do better!

The hermeneutic of the Church of God has long read the promise of God in Joel 2:28-29, "And afterward, I will pour out my Spirit on all people. Your sons and daughters will prophesy, your old men will dream dreams, your young men will see visions. Even on my servants, both men and women, I will pour out my Spirit in those days." as being fulfilled on the Day of Pentecost in Acts 2:17-18, "In the last days, God says, I will pour out my Spirit on all people. Your sons and daughters

will prophesy, your young men will see visions, your old men will dream dreams. Even on my servants, both men and women, I will pour out my Spirit in those days, and they will prophesy."

This is not a new or modern interpretation of Scripture, nor is it a radical or reactionary departure from the Bible. In fact, this is exactly what Luke claims in Acts 2:16, "This is what was spoken by the prophet Joel."

From the Day of Pentecost to today and until the Lord Jesus returns, we live in these days, the days when God has poured out His Spirit on all people, when both sons and daughters do prophesy, and God calls both men and women to be his Spirit-filled servants.

Yet when I was an undergraduate student all my fellow male Bible/Ministry majors received internships in local congregations while that year's sole female student, whose GPA was higher than most of our own, was not placed for a local church internship. The message was something like, "Perhaps the Lord has some other plan for you."

We Can Do Better!

For too long too many called women of God have received a similar message, "Perhaps the Lord has some other form of ministry for you other than being a pastor in the Church of God." Those women have gone into a host of other ministries where they are accepted, such as cross-cultural and missionary service, hospital and institutional chaplaincy, and other denominational clergy roles. The Church of God has missed out on the benefits of several generations of capable pastors, who happen to be women, because of this often-unspoken bias.





She has served in daycare ministry for 30 years culminating in taking a struggling daycare of seven children utilizing one room and building it over the course of thirteen years into a daycare of 150 children in a brand-new state- of-the-art \$1.8 million facility. She also served as a hospice chaplain in North Carolina for 4 years. Susan has been ordained in the Church of God (Anderson) since 1990 and the Wesleyan Church since 1999.

Currently, Pastor Susan is serving as the Associate Pastor at the First Church of God in Martinsville, Virginia. She has been in that ministry since January 2014. Susan has been on an extended medical leave of absence since December 2020.

Susan has experienced two major miracles of God's touch in her life physically since 2015 when she was diagnosed with Non-Hodgkin's Lymphoma at UVA. In 2018, Susan was diagnosed with Double-Hit Lymphoma which had morphed from her

She was released from the hospital on January 5, 2021 and is completing her recovery at home. She praises God for His healing touch and is looking forward to resuming her ministry at Martinsville sometime this spring.




